

- PADM 765 Public Sector Economics  
Examination of economic theory and application of economic tools that inform policy and management of public and nonprofit organizations. Course covers economic principles and economic decision making tools.
  
- PADM 760 State/Local Economic Development  
Introduction to theory and practice of economic development in the context of state and local government. Exploration of economic development policy and practice. Course examines economic development financing from the perspective of public purpose and community objectives.
  
- PADM 865 Financial Management Public & Nonprofit Organizations  
Analysis of financial condition of state and local government as well as nonprofit organizations; e.g. analysis of financial statements, examination of internal controls, application of the principal of the time value of money, introduction to basic investment analysis, analysis of municipal securities and municipal bonds. Prerequisite: PADM 765 or instructor's consent.
  
- PADM 866 Public Financial Management  
Capital budgeting, planning and financial management. Examination of capital improvement program; capital revenue and expenditure forecasting of capital priorities and long-term debt management. Course includes cash flow, cost-benefit, break-even and sensitivity modeling. Long-term capital planning, financial planning and fiscal policy that support asset and debt management is the focus. Prerequisite: PADM 865 or instructor's consent.
  
- PADM 867 State/Local Government Budgeting  
Emphasizes budget preparation, decision making, implementation and evaluation in local government to maintain a solid financial position. Examination of the political dimension of the government budgeting process as well as a variety of tools and techniques for budget preparation. Emphasizes both political and technical skills in managing public resources. Prerequisite: PADM 865 or instructor's consent.
